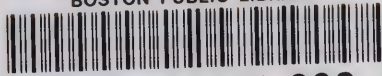


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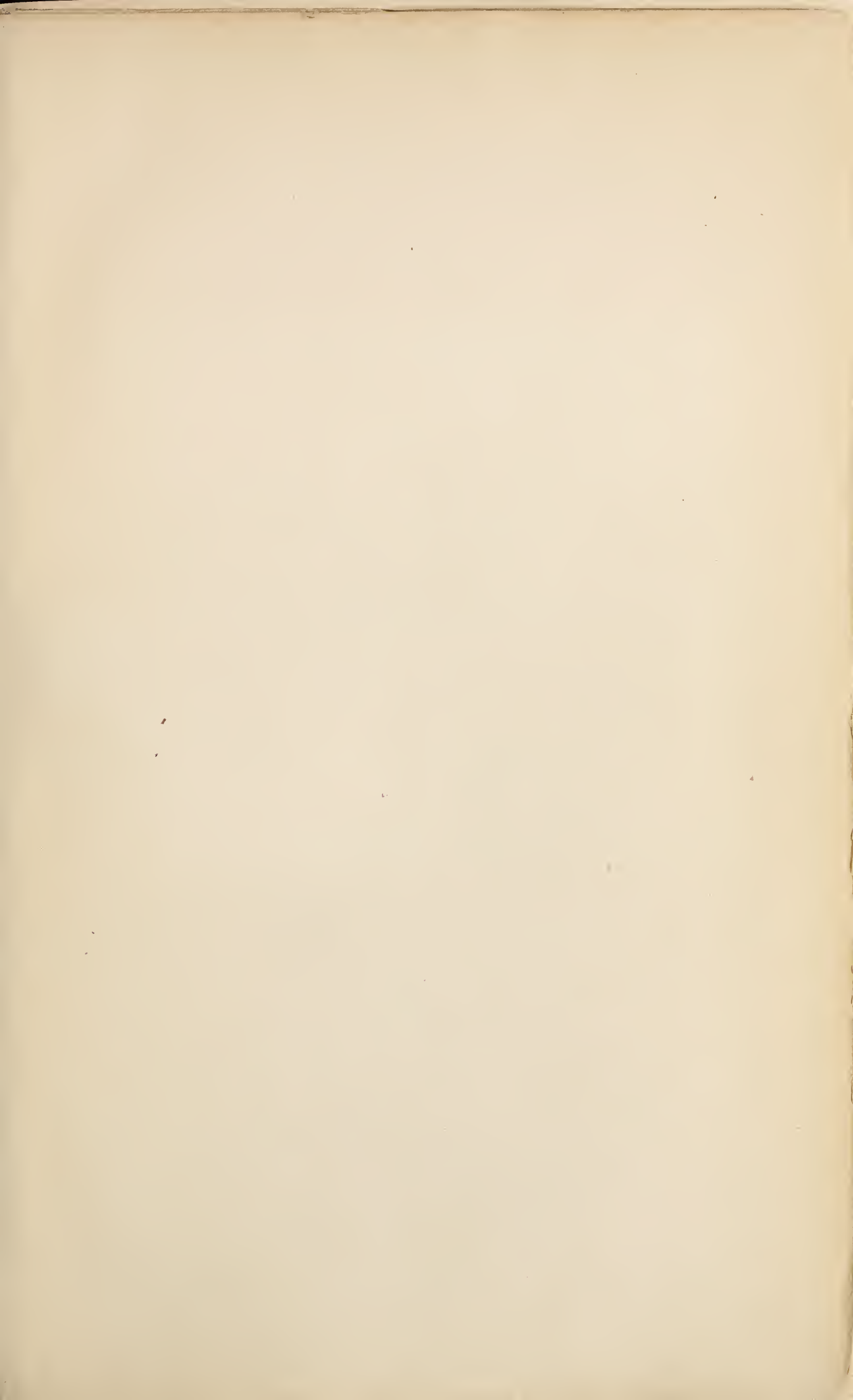

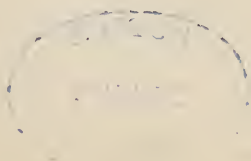

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INTRODUCTION.

The family name in the first form of which we have any authentic record was "le hore". One of the followers of William in his conquest of England in 1066 bore that name and was probably, like William, of Norman blood. When William the Conqueror had partially subjected the Welsh, many of his Norman followers were given lands or the command of fortified stations in Wales. The town of Pembroke was thus subjected in 1093 and William's follower named "le Hore" was there stationed. He and his male descendants undoubtedly took an active part in the border wars which raged in Wales from that time until the end of the twelfth century.

According to ancient traditions in England which are consistent with historical facts and which are considered by students of the subject to be well founded, one Sir William le Hore was stationed at or near Pembroke in 1169, as an immediate subordinate of Richard de Clare, first Earl of Pembroke, called "Strongbow".

In that year Diarmid mac Murchadha (Dermod Macmorrough), claimant to the Irish kingdom of Leinster, obtained the consent of the English king, Henry II, to solicit the aid of his subjects in efforts to secure the disputed kingdom. His first act was to recruit a band of about one hundred Norman knights from Pembroke and the neighborhood, who sailed from Pembroke under the leadership of Robert Fitzstephen and Maurice Fitzgerald, minor barons of the Welsh marches. They besieged and captured the Irish town of Wexford in May, 1169. Sir William le Hore was the standard bearer of that expedition and upon his standard was one of the Norman designs of an eagle, double-headed. By this capture King Dermod was restored to the control of the surrounding territory and he made extensive grants of land to the knights who had helped him to conquer it. His sovereignty was transferred to Henry II of England on King Dermod's death in 1172, and by King Henry to Strongbow in 1174, on Strongbow's succession to the throne of King Dermod whose daughter he married.

According to the tradition, King Dermod granted to Sir William le Hore at this time, in recognition of his services, the estate of Pole Hore in the barony of Forth, county of Wexford; together with the right to use as his armorial bearings "an eagle with expanded wings". The castle and estate of Pole Hore has ever since remained the property of lineal descendants of Sir William; and is today owned by Philip Herbert Hore, Esq.

The first record of these armorial bearings describes them in the language of heraldry as "an eagle with expanded wings, with two necks, within an engrailed bordure."

Other branches of the family of le Hore existed in England at an early date; many of them having served in early Parliaments. One of the descendants of Sir William of Wexford, according to the same tradition, went over to Devonshire in England to seek his fortune and married the heiress of Fforde of the town of Chagford in 1330. He settled at Chagford and founded the Devon family which was at first known as "Hore" and later as "Hoar" or "Hoare." The family seat was at what is now called Rushford Mill in what was formerly Risford, now known as Rushford, Chagford, Devon. Other branches of the family were settled in the South-east quarter of Devonshire. This family has its armorial insignia described in the record of the earliest visitation of Devonshire as "Sable an eagle displayed with two necks within a bordure engrailed argent." Its crest was "on a wreath of the colors, a deer's head and neck proper erased argent." Its earliest motto was "Datur Hora Amori," a pun like many of the ancient mottoes. Branches of the family from time to time assumed other mottoes, "Constanter" being now used by the Irish branch.

At Rushford the family in possession of the estate traced its descent from Robertus¹, through Robert², Robert³, William⁴, (living 1381), Robert⁵ (living 1397), William⁶ (living 1459), Robert⁷ (living 1470), William⁸ (living 1507), William⁹ (living 1525), William¹⁰ (living 1560), John¹¹ (died 1644), William¹² (died 1656), and William¹³ (born 1602), who sold the estate to the ancestor of the Earl of Portsmouth about 1630 and removed to London.

One Charles Hoare, of this family, perhaps a younger son of William¹⁰, settled at Frampton-on-Severn, about ten miles from the city of Gloucester, in the sixteenth century, where he acquired a considerable estate. He and his sons, who removed to the city of Gloucester and became very prominent merchants and office-holders, continued to use the crest and coat-of-arms above described.

The town of Taunton, Mass., was settled by emigrants from the town of Taunton in the county of Somerset, England. Taunton, England, was a large market town about half way between Gloucester and Chagford, and just south of Chagford was the port of Plymouth from which the early, and many of the later, Puritans sailed for the colonies. Taunton was almost the center of puritanism at that time.

Hezekiah Hoar was one of the original purchasers of the site of the town of Taunton, Mass., in 1637, and probably arrived in the colony about that time. There were several families in Eastern Devonshire in 1620 who spelled the name "Hore," and Hezekiah was first referred to by others in this country as "Hore" but he himself used the form "Hoar" which indicates relationship to the Chagford family. William¹³ of Chagford and his son founded and conducted a banking house in London.

Early tradition in America seems to have connected the Massachusetts Hoars generally with the banker, as early local historians state that the progenitor of the family was a wealthy London banker, whose sons emigrated to this country. This statement we now know to have been erroneous, but it lends strength to the probability that the American Hoars were collaterally related to the London bankers, and were all of the Chagford family. The circumstance that the long cherished names Robert and William were freely used among Hezekiah's descendants adds to the probability of a Chagford origin. Hezekiah may speculatively be considered as a direct descendant in the twelfth generation of Robert (Robertus) Hore¹ of Chagford; in the eighteenth generation of Sir William le Hore of Wexford, Ireland, and in the twenty-first generation of the first Norman follower of William the Conqueror.

Lexicographers have two opinions as to the meaning of the family name. Like most other family names its origin is traced to some common word of the language of the time. According to the theory adopted by the genealogists of the family in England, the name came through the Norman French, from the ancient French and Latin and was derived from a root common to the Latin word "hora," meaning originally a boundary or mark. As an "hora" or "hour" was a boundary mark on the sun dials formerly exclusively used to measure time, so was "hoar-stone" a designation anciently of memorial marks and boundary stones. Because such boundary stones became in time gray-headed with antiquity, the word acquired a secondary meaning of white or gray. The better lexicographers say that the word "hoar" as used in the expressions "hoary head" and "hoar frost" is derived from the Anglo-Saxon and early Scandinavian root "hor," meaning white or gray. Inasmuch as the name in its present application certainly came to England from Normandy, and as the Norman fighting men of that time were, themselves, Northmen or of Scandinavian or northern descent, it would seem probable that the lexicographers have the better of the argument, although it may well be true and is consistent with both theories that the Latin word and the Scandinavian, or northern word, are both derived from an older Amoric or Aryan root having the same basic meaning and perhaps the same genesis.

There is a tradition in several branches of descent from Hezekiah Hoar that the founders of the American family were three brothers who came at an early date to Plymouth colony from England, and that all trace has been lost of two of them. The compiler believes that this tradition is based upon fact, and that the three brothers were our Hezekiah, William and Richard. One Richard Hoar appears by the record of the Plymouth Colony to have settled at Yarmouth before 1643, but nothing further is known about him. One William Hoar, a baker, settled in Bristol and died there in 1697. He probably left no male issue, as his family was listed in 1689 as consisting of a wife, Hannah,

and three daughters, one of whom married between 1689 and 1697, Isaac Gorham, and another Isaac Waldron.

Besides the Hoar family now under consideration, there are many of the name in this country who are of different descent.

The descendants of Charles, of Gloucester, and his wife, Joane, are considered by the late Senator George Frisbie Hoar in his monograph in Volume 53 of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register. See also, account of one branch by Alfred W. Hoar of Monticello, Minn.

A considerable family of the name of *Horr* descends from one Abijah who was born in Scotland in 1626 and emigrated to Massachusetts in 1667.

Another family, largely of Rhode Island, descends from a William Hoar who is said to have been born in England before 1710 and to have emigrated to Bristol, R. I., shortly before 1743.

One William Hoar was in Salem in 1659. Removed to Boston where he married in 1669 Hannah, daughter of Robert Wright. They are known to have had there, Samuel, b. May 6, 1673; Joseph, b. March 15, 1675; Benjamin, b. Sept. 5, 1680; Paul, b. Dec. 23, 1682; William, b. March 1, 1685; and Hannah, b. March 5, 1687.

This may be the William above mentioned as being in Bristol later, as there seems to be no further trace of him or his sons in Boston.

There are some German citizens in this country named *Horr* or *Hor* who descended from Westphalians; and others notably in Baltimore and Philadelphia whose emigrating ancestors came from Büdingen, and Niederroden, Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany, in the middle of the nineteenth century.

The family of Hezekiah exemplifies the history of all early New England families. Theirs is the common record of successive waves of removal to new and more promising farming regions, first to western Massachusetts and Vermont; then to the river valleys of New York State's newest counties; then to the fertile middle West.

Its history has been preserved in the memories of its older members, and where those fail, local records supply many facts. The compiler has used local histories, the records of Plymouth colony; the deed records and vital statistics of Plymouth, Bristol and Franklin Counties of Massachusetts, and their towns; old letters and family bibles; and printed genealogies of other families, and he is certain of the accuracy of all entries in the direct lines of descent given. Some slight doubt still exists as to the accuracy of the entries of a few untraced children of the older families, but as no descent is traced through or from them, substantial accuracy is all that is required.

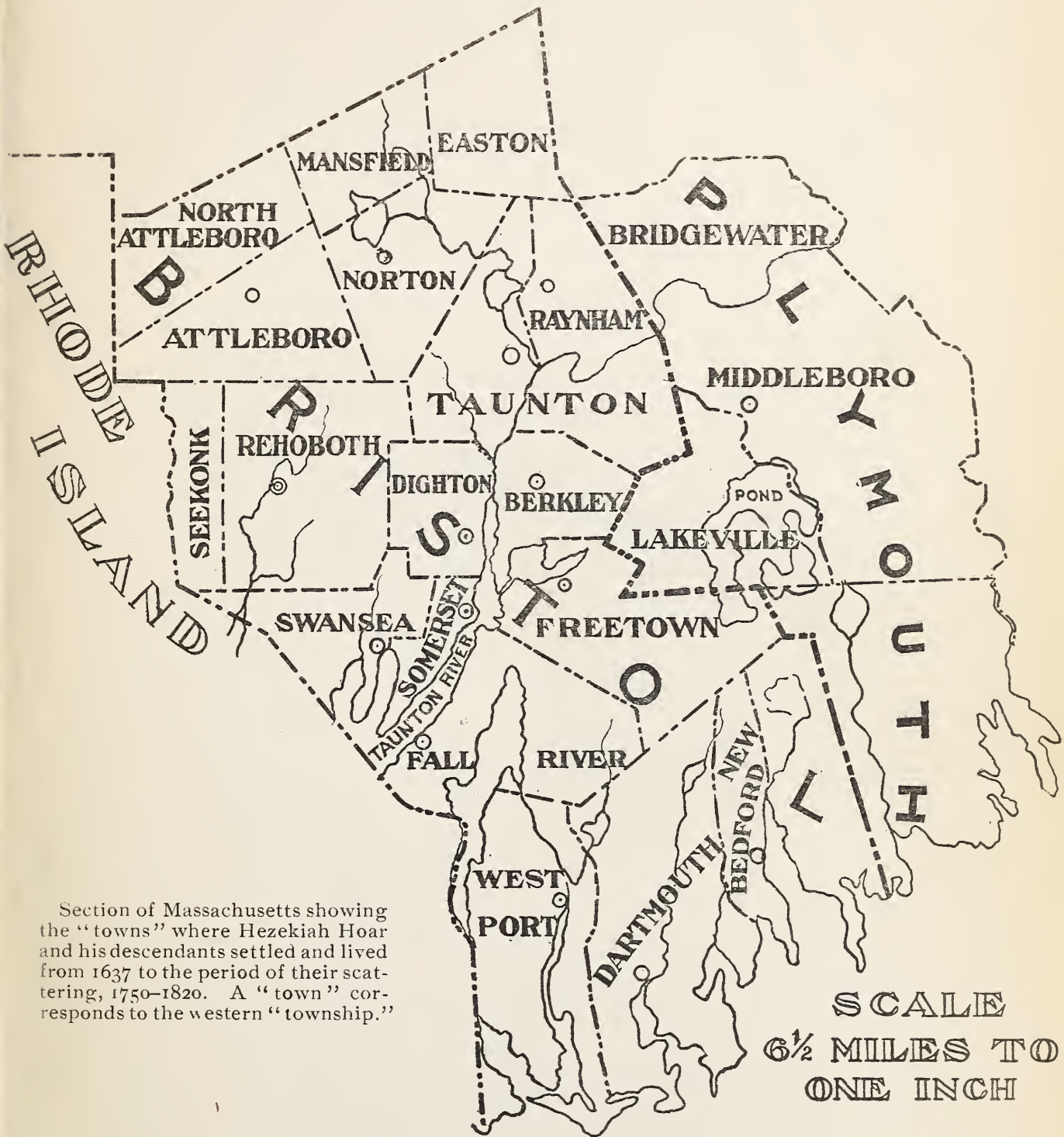

1. HEZEKIAH HOAR was in Scituate, Mass., as early as 1637, and probably came in 1633. He was one of the purchasers of the eight mile square known as Cohansett till Sept., 1639, and afterwards as the North Purchase of Taunton, Mass. He paid 100£ for his share. He was a prominent citizen of Taunton. He was the first signer of the articles of agreement of 1653 of the "Iron Works Company," operating the "bloomerie," the first iron works in America, and was one of its three lessees in 1660. He was surveyor of highways in 1651; constable in 1657, 1663 and 1672, and was enlisted as ensign in the expedition against the Dutch of New Amsterdam projected under the leadership of Capt. Miles Standish. Hezekiah's home was on the west corner of Winter street, then known as "Hoar's Lane." His wife's name was Rebecca, spelled Rebekah. The general court of the colony granted to her in 1666 forty acres of land adjoining Taunton. She probably died before 1692, as she does not join in Hezekiah's deed in that year. On February 27, 1692, he deeded all his property to his sons, Edward and Hezekiah, the home place to them for themselves; the other land in trust to convey 100 acres to each of his children. The deed was recorded August 4, 1693, which was probably just after Hezekiah's death. The Taunton of his day included the present towns of Taunton, Mansfield, Norton, Raynham, Dighton, Berkley and part of Freetown. An apparently different residence ascribed to a descendant is often therefore attributable solely to a change of territorial boundaries.

- vi. LIDIA, b. Mch. 24, 1665; d. before 1711; m. John WHIPPLE Nov. 16, 1688. A son JOB³ at Providence, R. I., 1711-1735. A son JOHN³ settled in Attleboro, 1744.
- vii. MARY, b. Sept. 22, 1669; d. after 1711; m. ——— MIACUM (Macomber?).

- viii. REBECCA, b. about 1671; d. April 30, 1694; m. Samuel SMITH, Feb. 20, 1690, at Taunton. Left SAMUEL,³ who later settled in Easton, Mass., and SARAH.³
- (3) ix. HEZEKIAH, b. Nov. 10, 1678.
2. NATHANIEL² HOAR (*Hezekiah*¹) married Sarah Wilbore, daughter of the town-clerk, Shadrach Wilbore, February 2, 1681. She received a bequest of two "ewe sheep" in 1691 from her cousin Joseph Wilbore. She b. March 18, 1661. Lived at Taunton. They were both dead before 1745.

3. HEZEKIAH² HOAR (*Hezekiah*¹) was under guardianship of his brother-in-law, John Spur, after his father's death. On reaching majority he confirmed a deed promised by his brother Edward. Having learned carpentry, he sold his interest in his father's estate, married Sarah _____ about 1700 and removed to Newport, R. I. He returned to Taunton before 1708, and settled as a farmer in the south part of the town. In 1708 he was one of the petitioners for the erection of The South Precinct, which was incorporated as the town of Dighton in 1712. He made a will March 20, 1728, and probably died soon after. His widow lived until after 1769, her dower in the homestead being reserved in its sale in that year. He and his brother, Edward, were trustees by deed from their father to convey 100 acres to each of Hezekiah's family, and under power of attorney from Edward, he made the conveyances in 1711.

4. SAMUEL³ HOAR (*Nathaniel*², *Hezekiah*¹) was a wheelwright at Taunton, until he bought and removed to a farm in Middleboro, Mass., about 1712. He founded the Middleboro family, and was a prosperous land owner. His purchases of land were numerous until 1740. In 1741 he divided most of his property between his surviving

sons, Robert and William. About 1712, he married Rebekah, daughter of Isaac Pierce. She died July 12, 1765. He died February 13, 1746, and was buried in Taunton. Their children were:

5. WILLIAM³ HOAR (*Nathaniel² Hezekiah¹*) lived with his father at the homestead in the village of Taunton. His father deeded the homestead to him in 1726, reserving his own life support, and they both join in conveying part of it to Jonathan³, in the same year. William died soon after 1749. He married Sarah, daughter of William Macomber, about 1715. She died January 13, 1753. A careful search of all known records fails to disclose the names of his children, except Anna. He and his brother Isaac were the only ones of the name then in Taunton whose children are not known. There is strong evidence to believe that he had:

- i. JACOB, d. 1756.
- ii. RUTH, m. William LEONARD, and had SARAH, who m. Corporal Nathaniel FIELD about 1775.
- iii. ANNA, m. ——— HODGES, before 1749.
- (13) iv. PHILIP.

6. JONATHAN³ HOAR (*Nathaniel², Hezekiah¹*) is known to be a son of Nathaniel by the deed of 1726. He sold part of the homestead in 1726, the remainder in 1742, and in the latter year bought land in and removed to Berkley where he lived till after 1748. His farm was near the town line between Berkley and old Middleboro. Shortly after his arrival in Berkley he had his first five children baptized by Rev. Samuel Tobey, first pastor of the Congregational church there, August 22, 1742, and that record is preserved. He served as ensign in the 3rd Mass. troop in the Louisburg Expedition of 1744-5. About 1732 he married Mary, daughter of Joseph and Ann (Makepeace) Staples, of Taunton.

Their descendants still live at New Salem, Mass.

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7. ISAAC³ HOAR (*Nathaniel², Hezekiah¹*) remained in Taunton and lived on a farm next to his brother Jonathan. As appears by a recital in a deed from his brother Samuel, he died in 1741, just after deeding his property to Samuel. He married Abigail, daughter of Jacob Staples, before 1727, at Taunton.

9. HEZEKIAH³ HOAR (*Hezekiah,² Hezekiah¹*) is referred to in deeds as "tanner" and "cordwainer." He went to the town of Woodstock, Conn., which was then and until 1752, in Massachusetts, where he resided in 1737. He subsequently returned to Dighton where he was living in 1769. He married Deborah — ~~Sackett~~.

He had:

- i. JAMES,⁴ who moved to Littleton, Mass.; then to Vermont, and later to Jefferson Co., N. Y., where he took the name "Horr." He served in the War of Independence. He had four daughters and two sons:

10. EDWARD³ HOAR (*Hezekiah,² Hezekiah¹*) was in Newport in 1740. He married Martha, daughter of Hugh Cole, of Swansea; marriage intention October 9, 1742. He returned to Dighton after his father's death, and removed to Scituate, where he lived from 1750 till after 1757. He

probably lived successively afterwards in Tiverton, R. I.; north-east precinct of Dutchess County, N. Y., and in the present Rensselaer County, about twenty-five miles east of Albany. He was a physician. His first five children are named in the Scituate records.

II. ROBERT⁴ HOAR (*Samuel,³ Nathaniel,² Hezekiah¹*) lived in Middleboro. He received gifts of land there from his father in 1741. He married (1) Sarah Willis of Bridgewater, Mass., March 8, 1743; (2) Judith Tinkham of Middleboro, October 4, 1753. She died February 26, 1761. He married (3) Mrs. Rachel Hoskins (Haskings on the record), November 26, 1761. She died after 1795. He died after 1784, possibly as late as 1791. He was a miller and operated a grist mill, which was still running in 1792 when sold by his son John. He divided his father's property with his brother William in 1765. He was a prosperous and active citizen.

12. WILLIAM HOAR⁴ (*Samuel,³ Nathaniel,² Hezekiah¹*) was known as "Deacon." On his tomb-stone in Staples St. cemetery, Taunton, the name is "Hoard" but he uses the

form "Hoar" in all of his many deeds. The Staples St. cemetery was erected by a reservation in his deed of 1745 of the old homestead as "a burying place for him and his family"; and was used as recently as 1854 for the interment of Katherine, wife of his son William. He conveyed his homestead in Middleboro, where he lived, to his son William in 1784; and other property to his son Luther in 1790. He married Sarah Hoskins at Middleboro, Jan. 31, 1745. She was born Jan. 1, 1727; died Nov. 15, 1774. He died April 25, 1795. He may have had other children than those recorded.

From the circumstance that Hzekiah Hoar had 77
considerable ready money to purchase his Taunton
holdings, and that his brother Tom, at date 1633,
was a lawyer, implying a prosperous parentage,

the William Hoar of Ashford Mills near
Crayford, Devonshire, who moved to London about 1630.
Such a conclusion accords with the tradition

An afternoon of examination of records hitherto inaccessible at the Western Reserve Historical Society leads to several comments of interest.

Whenever the publication of the "Devon and Cornwall Record Society" shall reach an issue of the "finis" of early days, I believe many records of 12" to 16" centuries relating to Hoar ancestors will be disclosed without too laborious research.

The completed parish register reprints, now indexed, show that there were many families of the name in both Devonshire and Cornwall at the close of the 15th century. See also the "Inquisition Post Mortem".

In "Genealogical gleanings in England", page 707, is mentioned the election of John Hoare as a fellow of Queen's College Oxford.

It now appears that our Hyszekiah Hoar was not the founder of the iron "bloomery" at Taunton, nor was that the first bloomery in New England. The real iron founder of Taunton was Leonard who came from Warrs. The original purchase of the site of Taunton was made by Henry Uxley and 45 associates, of whom Hyszekiah was one, in 1637. Hyszekiah had eight shares out of several hundred. The entire price paid was 100 pounds. Title came by grant from Plymouth Colony, and by deed from the Indian ruler, Massasoit.

The South purchase in which Hyszekiah had 11 shares was made in 1668, deed of 1672. The bloomery contract of 1653 which Hyszekiah signed first did not result in success. In the lease made soon after, the lessees were George Hall, Hyszekiah Hoar, and Francis Smith, representing themselves and others. Hyszekiah gave an order on the bloomery for iron as late as 1684. During the Indian war 1676-1679 the bloomery could not be operated.

Hezekiah's grandson Isaac (7. page 10) lived in that part of Taunton called Squabety, in 1727, south part of Taunton on or near the Middleborough line. He was one of several to petition to join the Taunton parish "precinct". They were admitted but were admonished that one of the conditions was that they must sing in church songs in "the old way".

The records also disclose that the London banker, then called "Goldsmith" who is named by several testators as having valuables on deposit, was Henry Hoar and that he was a contemporary of Hezekiah. Henry's father was William Hoar, who dealt in horses in London, and is recorded as making 700 pounds in a year. Henry's ^{male} line died out. A daughter married ~~him~~ into the lesser nobility. It appears that Henry and his father William were in London in 1630. The entry (ante) on page 77 should use Henry instead of William, and the father, William, the horse dealer, should be identified with William¹² of the Introduction, page 4.

After an illness of several months, Miss Lillian Dunbar entered into Rest at her home, 81 Thorn-dike street, Brookline, on Wednesday morning, January sixth.

She was the daughter of the late Captain Joseph and Sarah H. Dunbar and was born in Rye, N. H. Her early life was spent in East Boston, but for the past seventeen years, she was a resident of Brookline.

Miss Dunbar was a piano teacher of note, her pupils numbering in the hundreds. She was very original in her methods, progressive always, interesting and companionable, a guide and inspiration to every pupil, and to each one she gave most generously of herself.

She began the study of music when a child; was a graduate of the New England Conservatory, a pupil of John Orth and Ernst Perabo, and later studied the Leschetizky method with Mme. Hopekirk. Her playing was a delight to all who heard her and she did a great deal of concert work, which brought her the friendship of many noted musicians. For nine years she was organist at the Saratoga Street M. E. Church in East Boston, receiving her organ training from S. B. Whitney of the Church of the Advent. In recent years she attended music courses at the Harvard Summer School, where she was an enthusiastic loving student of music in various branches, and during these years of study and teaching, she acquired an extensive library.

A member of the Methodist Church from childhood, at the time of her death, she was affiliated with St. Mark's M. E. Church of Brookline.

Even greater than her love for music was Miss Dunbar's devotion to her home and the sisters who, since the death of the father and mother several years ago, have kept the home in Brookline. Filling the mother's place, at the same time close companion to an invalid sister, hers was a life of devotion, which is the embodiment of the highest type of woman—a noble character, of sweet and lovable disposition, high and lofty principles, a faithful, loyal friend and neighbor, one whom it were well to emulate.

Services were held at the residence, Friday afternoon, January eighth, at which Bishop John W. Hamilton, Dr. George S. Butters of Auburn-dale, Dr. Dillon Bronson, District Superintendent, and Dr. Willis P. Odell officiated.

AN OHIO PIONEER.

Mrs. Amy Lang Goes to Her Reward After a Useful, Generous Existence of Nearly a Century's Duration.

Died in Wellington, Ohio, Oct. 22, 1898, at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. P. S. Wright, Mrs. Amy Lang, in the ninety-fourth year of her age. Mrs. Lang was the daughter of Jesse Hart, and was born in Wallingford, Vermont in 1805. She came with her parents in 1812 to Portage county, Ohio. She married Reuel Lang in 1823, and settled in Elyria, where Mr. Lang bought a village lot for twenty dollars, and built one of the first frame houses in the town. A year later they bought a farm in Huntington, where they lived about fifty years. The remainder of their lives was spent in Wellington, where Mr. Lang died at the age of ninety-one.

Mrs. Lang was a fine representative of the pioneer women of the Western Reserve. Her standards and ideals were those of New England in the early part of this century. She was quiet and simple in her tastes and strongly disapproved of display or ostentation. She

was exceedingly kind and charitable, and it is doubtful if she ever had an acquaintance who did not love and respect her. She endured the trials of life with patience and resignation, and with the same unflinching courage which aided her in the early struggles in the almost unbroken forest, and sustained her to the end of her life, and helped her to welcome death. She lived to be nearly ninety-four years old, retaining her mental faculties to an unusual degree, and taking a lively interest in local and national events to within a few days of her death. 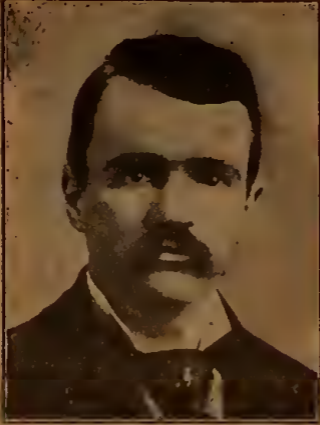
Occurred Thursday Last at

PROMINENT BUSINESS MAN

In Ithaca for Many Years - Son
of Former Congressman
Roswell G. Horr

Dispatches received from Pasadena, California, Friday morning last, notified his relatives and friends here that F. H. Horr had passed away at Pasadena hospital at 6 p. m. the evening previous. Mr. Horr had been in very poor health since about nine years ago, when he had a severe hemorrhage at the nose, which was checked with the greatest difficulty. As a result of prolonged over work, insufficient exercise, constant eye strain in the care of his business, and dyspepsia from which he was a sufferer, his eye sight became defective, his arteries more or less inelastic, his heart diseased, and finally as a final complication Bright's disease set in.

Two or three years after his first attack, Mr. Horr closed his partnership with his uncle, A. E. Pinney, which for nearly a quarter century had existed under the firm name of Pinney & Horr, and sought in rest and retirement the restoration of his broken health. But the change came too late. Gradually he failed until this winter when the cold weather seemed to affect him so unfavorably that he decided to spend a few months in a milder climate.



He reached his destination but the journey was too much for him. Soon after arrival he gave up. After some days of treatment in his own home, he was taken to Pasadena hospital, where he sank rapidly and Thursday evening, January 8, at 6 o'clock he breathed his last.

His remains reached Ithaca Wednesday night accompanied by his stricken wife, who had been through out his faithful attendant and companion, and his friend, F. P. Merrill. The funeral takes place today, Thursday, at his late home in Ithaca, at 2 p. m. Rev. J. Q. Durfey officiating. Burial will be in Ithaca cemetery. His daughter, Marjorie, and her husband Prof. Stanley Martin of Syracuse, New York, accompanied by Mr. Horr's sisters, Mrs. Matthew Ewart of Plainfield, N. J. and Mrs. Gilbert Hebbard of Whitesboro, N. Y. arrived in Ithaca Monday evening. Mrs. Horr and Mr. Merrill were joined in Chicago by Mr. Horr's only brother, Rolla, who resides at Duluth, Minn.

Frank H. Horr was born March 24, 1860 in Elyria, Ohio. His father was Roswell G. Horr. The family moved to Farmington, Missouri, where Mr. Horr was interested in some lead mines. In the 70's they moved to Saginaw where Mr. Horr became interested in the lumber business at West Branch and Summit, Ogema county. His mother's brother, A. E. Pinney went there in '77 and remained six years, conducting the lumber business for Mr. Horr. While he was still there Frank Horr went to Summit to conduct a hardware store for his father. In 1884 he was married to Miss Jennie Smith of Chicago, who survives him. In the spring of 1886 Mr. Horr and Mr. Pinney visited the west in search of a location for the hardware business. They returned to Saginaw, and hearing that the hardware store of Ed Lane in Ithaca was for sale, came here and purchased it. Mr. Horr took up his residence here in June 1886, and the partnership of Pinney & Horr continued until January 13, 1908, just five years ago when it was dissolved by mutual consent on account of Mr. Horr's poor health.

Mr. Horr was a member of the Knights of Pythias and Odd Fellows. He was one of the most active, thorough going, tactful and
